


Results of Council Input Survey

As part of this year's **National Recycling Week**, councils around Australia helped Planet Ark get a snapshot of their residents' recycling habits and mistakes.

A total of 152 Councils took part in the survey representing every state (except the ACT), 50% were from Regional areas with 40% of respondents in NSW. Below are some of the key results and themes that arose from this year's survey.



When finding out what mistakes residents were making the survey revealed that contamination was a big issue, with the use of plastic bags and general soft plastics placed in recycling bins amongst the biggest contaminants.


73% of participants indicated that 'reducing contamination in kerbside recycling' and 'reducing resident confusion' as HIGH PRIORITY

Looking to the future councils identified the main waste and recycling issues.

Educating residents and reducing confusion were key areas where councils wished to improve outcomes.




Councils want their residents to understand and improve the following recycling outcomes




Closing the Recycling Loop - Buy Recycled
